

# Minnesota Star

50" x 65"



# **MATERIALS:**

[1] AMNSH Panel
5/8 yard Blender Cream
5/8 yard Lady Slippers
1 yard Border Stripe
2-1/4 yards Word Toss Sage
3 yards Cream Grunge for backing
3/4 yards Cream or Word Toss Sage for binding

READ THROUGH ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE BEGINNING. PRESHRINK AND PRESS FABRICS. SEW PIECES RIGHT SIDES TOGETHER (RST) AND USE A 1/4" SEAM ALLOWANCE THROUGH-OUT. WOF = WIDTH OF FABRIC; LOF = LENGTH OF FABRIC; HST = HALF SQUARE TRIANGLE

# **CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:**

#### From AMNSH Panel:

Fussy cut [2] center prints to 15-1/2" squares

#### From Blender Cream Fabric:

Cut [2]  $-6" \times WOF"$  strips

Subcut [10] - 6" squares

Cut [3]  $-1" \times WOF"$  strips

Cut [1]  $-3-3/4" \times WOF"$  strip

Subcut [2]  $-6-1/2" \times 3-3/4"$  rectangles

Subcut [2]  $-13'' \times 3-3/4''$  rectangles

# From Lady Slippers Fabric:

Cut [2]  $-6" \times WOF"$  strips

Subcut [10] - 6" squares

Cut [4]  $- 1-1/2" \times WOF"$  strips

Subcut [4]  $- 1-1/2" \times 15-1/2"$  rectangles

Subcut [4]  $- 1-1/2'' \times 17-1/2''$  rectangles

# From Border Stripe Fabric:

Cut [2]  $-13'' \times LOF$  stripes

You want to fussy cut this so that it shows the pattern. I cut above the fishing and below the next fishing to have [4] full strips showing.

Subcut [2]  $-13'' \times 18-1/2''$  rectangles

# From Toss Sage Fabric:

Cut [6] $-7" \times WOF$  strips

Subcut [6]  $-7" \times 17-1/2"$  rectangles from [3] strips

Cut [2]  $-6" \times WOF$  strips

Subcut [10] - 6" squares

Subcut [8] - 4-3/4" squares

Cut [1]  $-4-3/4" \times WOF$  strip

Cut [3] - 3-1/2"  $\times$  WOF strips

Cut [1]  $-2-1/2" \times WOF$  strip

Subcut [2]  $-2-1/2" \times 14"$  rectangles

Subcut [8] - 2'' squares from scraps

#### **BLOCK ASSEMBLY:**

#### **1 & 2 BLOCKS**

1. Border the [2] AMNSH Panel pieces with Lady Slippers 1-1/2" strips. Sew on sides first, then top and bottom. Press flat and set aside.

# **3, 4 & 5 STAR BLOCKS**

- 1. Sort the 6" squares into the following sets (place RST and pin):
  - [4] Blender cream / Word Toss Sage
  - [4] Lady Slippers / Word Toss Sage
  - [4] Blender cream / Lady Slippers

Set remaining squares aside.







- 2. To make the HST, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the reverse side of [8] Blender Cream 6" squares and on [4] Lady Slippers 6" squares (see above diagram)
- 3. Sew 1/4" on each side of the drawn line.
- 4. Cut on the solid line.
- 4. Press to the dark side and trim to 4-3/4".
- 5. Sew the HSTs together into the star pattern, using the Word Toss Sage 4-3/4" squares for the corners. Square to 17-1/2". Make [2].



- 6. Sort the 6" squares into the following sets (place RST and pin):
  - [1] Blender cream / Word Toss Sage
  - [1] Lady Slippers / Word Toss Sage
  - [1] Blender cream / Lady Slippers

Using the remaining [2] squares from each fabric, you will make a smaller star (and a spare star that is not used).

- 7. Draw an additional diagonal line on [2] Blender Cream squares and on [1] Word Toss Sage squares.
- 8. Sew 1/4" on each side of both drawn lines.
- Cut the square apart by cutting a vertical and horizontal line exactly halfway through, and then cut the diagonally drawn lines. (Shown in gold)



- 10. Press open and trim to 2".
- 12. Sew the squares into the same star layout as before, using the Word Toss Sage 2" squares to the corners. Make 2.
- 13. Square the small star to 6-1/2". You will need only [1].

# **QUILT ASSEMBLY**

# **Center Stripe and Star**

- 1. Using [1] of the small stars, add the Blender Cream  $3-3/4" \times 6-1/2"$  rectangles to the right and left sides.
- 2. Add the Blender Cream  $3-3/4" \times 13"$  rectangles to the top and bottom of the star. Measures 13" square.



3. Sew the stripe strips to the right and left sides of the star to create the row.



4. Sew the Blender Cream 1" strips together, cut [2] — 49" lengths and sew to the top and bottom of star/strip unit.



- 5. Sew a Word Toss Sage 2-1/2"  $\times$  14" rectangle to the right and left sides to finish the row.
- 6. Sew the remaining [3] of the Word Toss Sage 7" strips together and then cut into [2] 53" strips.
- 7. Sew these strips to the top and bottom of the center stripe row.



#### The Stars and Panel Rows

1. Sew [2] Word Toss Sage  $7'' \times 17-1/2''$  rectangles to the left and right sides of the star.



- 2. On the first star add one of the already framed Panels to the right side and on the second star add the Panel to the left side of the star.
- 3. Finish the row with the remaining  $7" \times 17-1/2"$  rectangles to the panel side.





4. Sew the [3] pieces (panel/ star, center stripe, star/panel) together.



# **BORDER**

- 1. Sew [3] Word Toss Sage 3-1/2" strips together and then cut into [2] 53" strips.
- 2. Sew [1] strip to the top and [1] strip to the bottom to complete the quilt!

# **FINISHING:**

- Create backing. A great use for the leftover
   [2] panel pieces, extra small star, and stripe fabric is to make a fun backing!
- 2. Layer quilt top, batting and backing and quilt as desired.
- 3. Bind.
- 4. Enjoy!
