MATERIALS:

1/8 yard Chickens
1/8 yard Counties Aqua
1/4 yard Counties Yellow
1/4 yard Crops
1/3 yard Farm
1 yard Flowers Multi
3/8 yard Flowers Orange
1-1/3 yards Flowers Teal
1 yard Patchwork
1/8 yard Blender Aqua
1/8 yard Blender Checked
1-1/3 yards Blender Dots Tan on White
1/8 yard Blender Green
1/8 yard Blender Peach
1/8 yard Blender Pink
1/8 yard Blender Pumpkin

READ THROUGH ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE BEGINNING. SEW PIECES RIGHT SIDES TOGETHER AND USE A 1/4" SEAM ALLOWANCE THROUGHOUT UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED. WOF - WIDTH OF FABRIC; LOF = LENGTH OF FABRIC; RST - RIGHT SIDES TOGETHER; HST - HALF SQUARE TRIANGLES

Cut and label pieces after reading through the pattern. You have the option of stopping at the Main Quilt (MQ) for a table topper/wall hanging. The fabrics needed have an asterisk by the letter.

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

From Chickens Fabric:

Cut [1] — 3-7/8" × WOF strip
Subcut [8] — 3-7/8" squares (T)
Subcut [2] — 3-1/2" squares (Q)

From Counties Yellow Fabric:

Cut [1] — 4-1/8" × WOF strip
Subcut [4] — 4-1/8" squares (C)*
Subcut [4] — 3-7/8" squares (T)

From Counties Aqua Fabric:

Cut [1] — 3-1/2" × WOF strip
Subcut [5] — 3-1/2" squares (Q)

From Crops Fabric:

Cut [1] — 6-1/2" × WOF strip
Subcut [1] — 6-1/2" square (E)*
Subcut [8] — 3-7/8" squares (T)

From Farm Fabric:

Cut [1] — 9-1/2" × WOF strip
Subcut [4] — 9-1/2" squares (P)

From Flowers Multi Fabric:

Cut [1] — 13-1/2" × WOF strip
Subcut [1] — 13-1/2" square (F)*
Subcut [1] — 7-1/2" square (B)*
Subcut [3] — 6-1/2" squares (H)*
Cut [1] — 6-1/2" × WOF strip
Subcut [1] — 6-1/2" square (H)*
Subcut [4] — 3-7/8" squares (T)
Subcut [4] — 3-1/2" squares (A)*
Cut [6] — 2-1/2" or 2-1/4" × WOF strips, binding

From Flowers Orange Fabric:

Cut [1] — 7-1/8" × WOF strip
Subcut [4] — 7-1/8" squares (G)*
Cut [1] — 3-7/8" × WOF strip
Subcut [4] — 3-7/8" squares (T)

From Flowers Teal Fabric:

Wait until quilt top center is complete and an accurate measurement can be taken before making subcuts for borders.

Cut [11] — 2-1/2" × WOF strips
Sew [7] strips together end to end
Set [4] strips aside
Cut [5] — 3" × WOF strips
Sew [3] strips together end to end

From Patchwork Fabric:

When cutting the patchwork print fabric, you may want to cut along a line in the print and not just cut a strip as measured so that the design lies square to the blocks.

Cut [4] — 6-1/2" × WOF strips
Subcut [2] — 6-1/2" × 28-1/2" strips (L)*
Subcut [2] — 6-1/2" × 40-1/2" strips (M)*

From Blender Aqua Fabric:

Cut [1] — 3-1/2" × WOF strip

Subcut [5] — 3-1/2" squares (Q)

From Blender Checked Fabric:

Cut [1] — 3-1/2" × WOF strip

Subcut [3] — 3-1/2" squares (Q)

From Blender Green Fabric:

Cut [1] — 3-7/8" × WOF strip

Subcut [4] — 3-7/8" squares (T)

Subcut [2] — 3-1/2" squares (Q)

From Blender Peach Fabric:

Cut [1] — 3-1/2" × WOF strip

Subcut [3] — 3-1/2" squares (Q)

From Blender Pink Fabric:

Cut [1] — 3-1/2" × WOF strip

Subcut [5] — 3-1/2" squares (Q)

From Blender Pumpkin Fabric:

Cut [1] — 3-1/2" × WOF strip

Subcut [5] — 3-1/2" squares (Q)

From Blender Dots Tan on White Fabric:

Cut [4] — 3-7/8" × WOF strips

Subcut [32] — 3-7/8" squares (S)

Cut [8] — 3-1/2" × WOF strips



Subcut [88] — 3-1/2" squares (R)

BLOCK ASSEMBLY:


Block 1

Block 1 uses Flowers Multi 7-1/2" square (B), [4] 3-1/2" squares (A), [4] Counties Yellow 4-1/8" squares (C) and [1] Crops 6-1/2" square (E).


1. With (B) square right side up, lay [2] (C) squares in opposite corners RST on the (B) square. Draw a diagonal line from [1] corner to the opposite corner.
2. Stitch 1/4" away on each side of the line.
3. Cut on the drawn line. Press the (C) out.



4. Next, lay a (C) square RST in the lower corner of unit from Step 3. Draw a diagonal line as shown and stitch 1/4" from the line on each side of the line.
5. Cut on the diagonal line. Press. Repeat with the other unit from Step 3, yielding [4] Flying Geese. Trim units to 3-1/2" × 6-1/2".



6. Sew a Flying Geese to the top edge of Crops 6-1/2" square (E). Be sure the points face out. Press.
7. Attach a Flying Geese to the bottom (opposite) edge and press.
8. Attach an Multi Flowers 3-1/2" squares (A) to each end of the (2) remaining Flying Geese.
9. Attach these units to the sides of Crops 6-1/2" square (E) making sure to match the seams. You now have Crop Block #1 (CB).




10. Now you will be adding on to the first block to create a larger version that leaves Crop Block #1 (CB) as the center.

Block 2

Block 2 uses Flowers Multi 13-1/2" square (F), [4] Flowers Multi 6-1/2" squares (H), and [4] Flowers Orange 7-1/8" squares (G).

1. Using the same process used for Block 1, lay the Flowers Multi square (F) face up and lay the Flowers Orange squares (G) in the opposite corners. Draw your diagonal line.
2. Stitch 1/4" from the line on both sides.
3. Cut on the diagonal line. Press open.
4. Next, lay a (G) piece back in the lower corner of unit from Step 3, draw your diagonal line
5. Stitch 1/4" from the line on both sides of the line.
6. Cut on the diagonal line. Press. Repeat with the other unit from Step 3, yielding [4] Flying Geese. Trim units to 6-1/2" × 12-1/2".

- Add a Flying Geese block to the top edge of the **(CB)** Block.
- Attach a Flying Geese unit to the bottom (opposite) edge of the **(CB)** Block. Press.
- Sew a Flowers Multi 6-1/2" square **(H)** to both ends of a Flying Geese unit. Repeat with the remaining Flying Geese units.
- Attach a Flying Geese unit to the remaining sides of **(CB)** Block to create the Center Block. Be sure to match your seams. Press.



QUILT TOP ASSEMBLY

- Next step will frame the Center Block using the strips that you have previously sewn together end to end. Measure Center Block down the middle for the sides and across the middle for the top and bottom.
 - Cut [2] Flowers Teal 2-1/2" strips to Center Block length, approximately 24-1/2". Sew Flowers Teal strips to the right and left sides of the Center Block. Press.
 - Cut [2] Flowers Teal 2-1/2" strips to Center Block width, approximately 28-1/2". Sew Flowers Teal strips to the top and bottom of the Center Block. Press.
 - Attach a Patchwork 6-1/2" x 28-1/2" strip **(L)** to the sides of the Flowers Teal border.
 - Then, sew a Patchwork 6-1/2" x 40-1/2" strips **(M)** to the top and bottom.
- NOTE:** When I added Patchwork borders, I had the top so that it was right-side up and the bottom so that it was right-side up as well. This made it a definite top and bottom. I then had the sides facing into the quilt. You will have to decide how you want this border section to look before you attach them to the Teal border.
- Next step will frame the Center Block using the strips that you have previously sewn together end to end. Measure Center Block

down the middle for the sides and across the middle for the top and bottom.

- Cut [2] Flowers Teal 3" strips to Center Block length, approximately 40-1/2". Sew Flowers Teal strips to the right and left sides of the Center Block. Press.
- Cut [2] Flowers Teal 3" strips to Center Block width, approximately 46-1/2". Sew Flowers Teal strips to the top and bottom of the Center Block. Press.
- Press seams. You now have the main quilt block **(MQ)** (This is where you would stop for a table topper / wall hanging.) It will be about 46-1/2" square.




BORDER ASSEMBLY

Shoofly Blocks

- These blocks use [64] Blender Dot 3-1/2" squares **(R)**, [32] Blender Dot 3-7/8" squares **(S)**, and [16] pairs of 3-7/8" squares Print fabrics **(T)** (This equals [32] squares) and [16] 3-1/2" squares **(Q)** of Various Blenders.
- Cut the Blender Dot **(S)** and the Print **(T)** squares in half on the diagonal.
- You will need [4] triangles of the same Print for each outer block. Sew a Blender Dot **(S)** to a print **(T)**. Press them open. Repeat until you have a [4] half-square triangle (HST) blocks of the same print. These should measure 3-1/2" square.
- Following layout shown, sew a Blender Dot 3-1/2" square **(R)** in between [2] HSTs, creating Row 1.




- Row 2 is a 3-1/2" square **(Q)** of Various Blenders sewn in between [2] Blender Dot 3-1/2" squares **(R)**.
- Row 3 is the created the same as Row 1.
- Sew the [3] rows together to create the Shoofly Block, measuring 9-1/2". Make [16].



- Sew a various Print 3-1/2" squares **(Q)** in between [2] Blender Dots Tan on White 3-1/2" squares **(R)**. Make [12].



- Starting with a Shoofly Block, alternate [4] Shoofly Blocks with [3] units from Step 8. Be sure to match the seams of the center **(Q)** to the center section of the Shoofly block. Make [4].



- Attach a border unit from Step 9 to each side of the quilt block center (MQ).
- On the remaining [2] Shoofly units from Step 9, sew a Farm 9-1/2" squares **(P)** to each end.
- Attach them to the top and bottom of the quilt top center (MQ). Be sure that the Farm blocks face right side up and the seams line up.



- Measure your quilt down the middle to get your measurement for the outside border Flower Teal 2-1/2" strips, previously sewn together end to end.
- Cut [2] strips this length. Attach strips to right and left side of the quilt. Press.
- Measure your quilt across the center. This will give you the size you need for the top and bottom borders. Cut and sew strips to the top and bottom of quilt top center. Press.

FINISHING:

- Layer the quilt top with batting and backing.
- Quilt as desired.
- Bind.
- Label & Enjoy!
